In 1987, Sonja Barendregt obtained her Master's degree in Business Economics at Erasmus University Rotterdam. In 1990, she completed her post graduate Accountancy qualification at Erasmus University.

Current positions

Sonja Barendregt is a member of the Supervisory Board of ASR Nederland N.V. She also serves as chair of the Audit & Risk Committee. Her initial appointment took place on 31 May 2018.

Previous positions

Sonja Barendregt has extensive experience in a wide range of management, advisory and supervisory roles. Her career began in 1975 at one of the legal predecessors of the audit and advisory firm PwC. Between 1998 and 2017, she was partner at PwC, specialising in the financial sector. During this period, she also held several prominent positions, including; chair of PwC's 'International Pension Group', member of PwC's 'European Strategic Diversity Council', chair of the 'Pension Funds Industry Group', chair of the 'Investment Management Industry Group', and member of the 'European Investment Management Leadership Team'. From 2017 until April 2021, she was a member of the Supervisory Board of de Volksbank N.V., where she also served as chair of the Audit Committee.

Other positions

In addition to her role at a.s.r., Sonja Barendregt is currently a member of the Supervisory Board of Robeco Holding N.V. and Robeco Institutional Asset Management B.V., and chair of the Audit & Risk Committee. She is also chair of the Oversight Committee of Robeco Indices B.V.

Reason for nomination for reappointment

Sonja Barendregt was appointed as a member of the Supervisory Board on 31 May 2018 and was reappointed for her second four year term on 25 May 2022. In line with the Dutch Corporate Governance Code, a Supervisory Board member may be reappointed after a period of eight years for a two year term, which can then be extended by a maximum of two years.

With a view to stability, the preservation of institutional knowledge related to the Aegon transaction, and continuity within the Supervisory Board, Sonja Barendregt has been asked to make herself available for reappointment for a two year term. The Supervisory Board is pleased that she is willing to continue contributing to a.s.r.

Sonja Barendregt has broad experience within the financial sector, including with insurers, banks, pension funds and investment institutions, which is of great value to a.s.r. She has extensive knowledge in areas such as finance, audit, risk, compliance and the partial internal model, and therefore brings the right expertise and experience. The Supervisory Board considers it important that she can continue her contribution to a.s.r. Furthermore, she knows a.s.r.'s strategy well and is a strong fit with culture of a.s.r.
